<b>Absentee</b>	A student who is not present in school or class
<b>Abstract</b>	Art that does not attempt to represent an accurate depiction of visual reality but instead uses shapes, colours, forms, and gestural marks to achieve its effect
<b>Absurd</b>	Ridiculous or nonsensical
<b>Abundance</b>	A large quantity or plenty of something
<b>Academic</b>	Pertaining to education and scholarship, especially at the university level
<b>Accommodate</b>	To provide lodging or make room for
<b>Accountability</b>	The state of being responsible for one's actions and decisions
<b>Acquisition</b>	The act of obtaining or gaining possession
<b>Adaptable</b>	Able to adjust or change in response to new or changing circumstances
<b>Adorn</b>	To decorate or add beauty to
<b>Adversary</b>	An opponent or enemy
<b>Aesthetic</b>	Relating to beauty or the appreciation of beauty
<b>Alarm</b>	A device that gives a warning or signal, typically to alert of danger or wake someone up
<b>Algorithm</b>	A step-by-step procedure or set of rules for solving a problem or performing a task, often used in computer science and mathematics
<b>Alleviate</b>	To make something less severe or more bearable
<b>Alliteration</b>	The repetition of initial consonant sounds in a sequence of words, often used for poetic or rhetorical effect

<b>Ambiguous</b>	Having more than one possible meaning
<b>Ambitious</b>	Having a strong desire to achieve success or greatness
<b>Anaesthesia</b>	A medical technique or medication used to induce a reversible loss of sensation or consciousness for surgical procedures or pain relief
<b>Analysis</b>	A detailed examination or study
<b>Antibiotic</b>	A type of medication used to treat bacterial infections by inhibiting the growth and multiplication of bacteria
<b>Anticipate</b>	To expect or foresee something happening
<b>Apathy</b>	A lack of interest, enthusiasm, or concern
<b>Apprehension</b>	Anxiety or fear about the future
<b>Aspiration</b>	A strong desire or goal one hopes to achieve in the future, often driven by ambition
<b>Assertive</b>	Confident and self-assured, able to express one's opinions and needs in a direct and respectful manner
<b>Assignment</b>	A task or piece of work assigned to students
<b>Athlete</b>	A person who participates in sports or physical exercises, often as a competitor
<b>Authenticity</b>	The quality of being genuine or real
<b>Avalanche</b>	A sudden and massive flow of snow, ice, and debris down a mountainside
<b>Backpack</b>	A bag carried on the back, often used to carry books and school supplies
<b>Beneficial</b>	Favourable or advantageous
<b>Beneficiary</b>	A person who receives benefits or advantages

<b>Benevolent</b>	Showing kindness and goodwill
<b>Bicycle</b>	A two wheeled vehicle powered by pedalling
<b>Biodiversity</b>	The variety and variability of life forms on Earth, including species diversity, genetic diversity, and ecosystem diversity
<b>Biosphere</b>	The part of Earth where living organisms exist, including the land, water, and atmosphere
<b>Blackboard</b>	A flat, black surface used for writing or displaying information with chalk
<b>Brevity</b>	The quality of being brief or concise
<b>Bureaucracy</b>	A system of government or management characterized by rules and regulations
<b>Cacophony</b>	A harsh, discordant mixture of sounds
<b>Calculator</b>	An electronic device used for mathematical calculations
<b>Calculus</b>	A branch of mathematics that deals with rates of change and the accumulation of quantities, often used in the study of functions, derivatives, and integrals
<b>Calendar</b>	A system for organizing and keeping track of dates, months, and years
<b>Camouflage</b>	The use of disguise to blend in with the surroundings
<b>Campus</b>	The physical grounds and buildings of a university where students attend classes and engage in various activities
<b>Canopy</b>	The upper layer of vegetation in a forest, consisting of tree branches and leaves that form a dense covering
<b>Canvas</b>	A heavy, closely woven fabric often used as a surface for painting with oils or acrylics
<b>Capitulate</b>	To surrender or give in under certain conditions
<b>Capricious</b>	Unpredictable or subject to sudden changes in mood or behaviour

<b>Casting</b>	The process of selecting actors to play specific roles in a film or production
<b>Catalyst</b>	Something that triggers a change or reaction
<b>Cautious</b>	Careful and vigilant to avoid potential dangers
<b>Cinematography</b>	The art and technique of capturing moving images on film or digitally, including camera work, framing, and lighting
<b>Circumvent</b>	To find a way around an obstacle or problem
<b>Coach</b>	A person responsible for training and instructing athletes or teams in a particular sport
<b>Coalesce</b>	To come together and form a whole
<b>Collaborate</b>	To work together with others on a project or task
<b>Commemorate</b>	To honour and remember a significant event or person
<b>Compassionate</b>	Showing kindness, understanding, and empathy toward others, especially in times of suffering or need
<b>Competition</b>	A contest or rivalry between individuals, teams, or athletes to determine a winner
<b>Composition</b>	The arrangement of elements (such as shapes, colours, lines, and forms) within an artwork to create a visually pleasing and balanced result
<b>Comprehend</b>	To understand or grasp the meaning of
<b>Conquer</b>	To overcome or defeat by force
<b>Conscientious</b>	Diligent, careful, and thorough in one's work or duties
<b>Consequence</b>	The result or effect of an action
<b>Contradict</b>	To assert the opposite of what someone else has said

<b>Coral reef</b>	A marine ecosystem made up of colonies of tiny animals called coral polyps
<b>Cordial</b>	Warm and friendly in a sincere manner
<b>Credible</b>	Trustworthy and believable
<b>Curriculum</b>	The courses, subjects, and content that make up a program of study at a university
<b>Debilitate</b>	To weaken or make feeble
<b>Deceive</b>	To mislead or trick someone
<b>Deceptive</b>	Misleading or giving a false impression
<b>Deficient</b>	Lacking in some way or falling short
<b>Degree</b>	An academic title or qualification awarded by a university upon the completion of a program of study, such as a Bachelor's degree or Master's degree
<b>Deliberate</b>	Done intentionally or with careful consideration
<b>Delicate</b>	Fragile or easily damaged
<b>Desk</b>	A piece of furniture with a flat surface for writing or studying
<b>Desolate</b>	Deserted or barren
<b>Determination</b>	The firmness of purpose and resolve to accomplish a goal despite challenges or obstacles
<b>Dew</b>	Tiny water droplets that form on surfaces overnight when the temperature drops, especially on plants and grass
<b>Diagnosis</b>	The process of determining the nature of a disease or condition through examination and testing
<b>Dilemma</b>	A difficult choice between two equally undesirable options

<b>Diligent</b>	Hardworking and attentive to details
<b>Dinner</b>	The main meal of the day, often eaten in the evening
<b>Diploma</b>	A certificate awarded upon successful completion of a program or course of study
<b>Director</b>	The person responsible for guiding the creative aspects of a film, including working with actors and overseeing the production
<b>Discrepancy</b>	A difference or inconsistency between two things that should be the same
<b>Disposition</b>	A person's inherent qualities of mind and character
<b>Dribble</b>	In sports like basketball and soccer, it refers to the skill of controlling and manoeuvring a ball while moving
<b>Drive</b>	A compelling urge or motivation that propels a person to pursue a particular course of action
<b>Dune</b>	A mound or ridge of sand formed by wind or water, often found in deserts and coastal areas
<b>Easel</b>	A portable stand used by artists to support a canvas or drawing board while working on a painting or drawing
<b>Eccentric</b>	Unconventional or strange in behaviour
<b>Eclectic</b>	Selecting or choosing from various sources or styles
<b>Editing</b>	The process of selecting, arranging, and manipulating footage to create a coherent and engaging film or video
<b>Education</b>	The process of acquiring knowledge, skills, and values through teaching and learning
<b>Elaborate</b>	Detailed and intricate
<b>Elevator</b>	A vertical transportation device used to move people or goods between floors in a building
<b>Eloquent</b>	Fluent and persuasive in speech or writing, often characterized by the ability to express ideas effectively



<b>Elusive</b>	Difficult to capture, understand, or define
<b>Empathetic</b>	Showing the ability to understand and share the feelings of others, often characterized by compassion
<b>Empathy</b>	The ability to understand and share another person's feelings
<b>Empower</b>	To give someone the authority or power to do something
<b>Endorse</b>	To approve or support something openly
<b>Endurance</b>	The ability to withstand hardship or adversity
<b>Enigma</b>	A mystery or puzzling situation
<b>Enrolment</b>	The process of registering and officially joining a university as a student
<b>Enthusiasm</b>	Intense interest or excitement
<b>Ephemeral</b>	Lasting for a very short time; fleeting
<b>Epiphany</b>	A moment of sudden realization or understanding in a story, often leading to a change in a character's perspective or behaviour
<b>Equation</b>	A mathematical statement that shows the equality of two expressions or quantities, often written with an equals sign (=)
<b>Erosion</b>	The gradual wearing away of soil, rock, or land surfaces by natural processes such as wind, water, or ice
<b>Estuary</b>	A partially enclosed coastal body of water where freshwater from rivers and streams meets and mixes with saltwater from the ocean
<b>Ethical</b>	Conforming to accepted moral principles
<b>Exaggerate</b>	To overstate or magnify the truth
<b>Exams</b>	Formal tests or assessments to evaluate knowledge and skills



<b>Exemplary</b>	Serving as a perfect example or model
<b>Exemplify</b>	To serve as a typical example of
<b>Exquisite</b>	Extremely beautiful or delicately crafted
<b>Fabricate</b>	To invent or concoct something, typically with deceitful intent
<b>Factorial</b>	The product of all positive integers from 1 to a given number, denoted by "n!" (e.g., $5! = 5 \times 4 \times 3 \times 2 \times 1 = 120$ )
<b>Fascinate</b>	To attract and hold someone's attention
<b>Faucet</b>	A device used to control the flow of water from a pipe
<b>Fieldwork</b>	Research or practical work conducted outside the classroom, often in the field
<b>Flora</b>	The plant life of a particular region, habitat, or geological period
<b>Flourish</b>	To grow or develop in a healthy or vigorous way
<b>Foliage</b>	The leaves of a plant, collectively, especially in dense growth or on branches or trees
<b>Foreshadowing</b>	A literary device in which hints or clues are given about future events in a story
<b>Formidable</b>	Inspiring fear or respect due to size, strength, or skill
<b>Foul</b>	A violation of the rules in sports that results in a penalty for the offending player or team
<b>Fraction</b>	A mathematical expression representing a part of a whole, consisting of a numerator (the top number) and a denominator (the bottom number), written as a/b
<b>Frivolous</b>	Lacking in seriousness or importance
<b>Frustration</b>	The feeling of being upset or annoyed due to obstacles or delays

<b>Galvanize</b>	To shock or stimulate into action
<b>Gastronomy</b>	The art and science of good eating; culinary culture
<b>Generosity</b>	A willingness to give or share freely
<b>Genre</b>	A category or type of literature or art characterized by specific themes, styles, or conventions (e.g., science fiction, romance, mystery)
<b>Geography</b>	The study of the Earth's physical features, climate, and landscapes
<b>Geometry</b>	A branch of mathematics that focuses on the properties and relationships of shapes, sizes, and dimensions, including points, lines, angles, and surfaces
<b>Geyser</b>	A natural spring that periodically ejects a column of hot water and steam into the air
<b>Glacier</b>	A large mass of ice that moves slowly down a mountain valley, formed from the accumulation and compaction of snow
<b>Goal</b>	A target or endpoint in various sports, such as a net in soccer or hockey
<b>Graduation</b>	The ceremony marking the completion of a degree or educational program
<b>Gratitude</b>	A feeling of thankfulness or appreciation
<b>Gravitate</b>	To be attracted to or drawn toward something
<b>Grocery</b>	A store that sells food and other household items
<b>Habitat</b>	The natural environment or place where a particular plant or animal species lives and thrives
<b>Hesitation</b>	A momentary pause or uncertainty before taking action
<b>Hibernation</b>	A state of reduced metabolic activity in animals during the winter to conserve energy
<b>Hierarchy</b>	A system of ranking or organizing by levels of authority

<b>History</b>	The study of past events and their impact on society
<b>Homework</b>	Tasks and assignments given to students to complete outside of school
<b>Homogeneous</b>	Of the same kind or nature; uniform in composition
<b>Hue</b>	The name of a colour on the colour wheel, such as red, blue, or green
<b>Hypertension</b>	A medical term for high blood pressure, a condition that can increase the risk of heart disease and stroke
<b>Hypothetical</b>	Based on a supposition or assumption
<b>Illuminate</b>	To light up or clarify
<b>Immaculate</b>	Perfectly clean, pure, or without flaws
<b>Imminent</b>	About to happen or occur very soon
<b>Impartial</b>	Unbiased or fair
<b>Impressionism</b>	A 19th century art movement characterized by the use of small brush strokes and an emphasis on capturing the fleeting effects of light and colour in outdoor scenes
<b>Inadvertent</b>	Happening by chance or unintentionally
<b>Incarcerate</b>	To imprison or confine in a jail or prison
<b>Incentive</b>	A motivating factor or stimulus that encourages someone to take action or do something
<b>Incessant</b>	Continuous and unending
<b>Ineffable</b>	Too great or extreme to be expressed or described in words
<b>Inevitable</b>	Certain to happen; unavoidable

<b>Inflammation</b>	The body's response to injury or infection, often characterized by redness, swelling, pain, and heat in the affected area
<b>Ingenious</b>	Clever and inventive
<b>Inherent</b>	Existing as a natural or essential quality
<b>Innovation</b>	The introduction of something new or inventive
<b>Inquisitive</b>	Curious and eager to learn or seek knowledge by asking questions
<b>Insatiable</b>	Impossible to satisfy or quench
<b>Inspiration</b>	A source of creative or intellectual stimulation that motivates and encourages new ideas or actions
<b>Instructor</b>	A teacher or person who imparts knowledge or instruction
<b>Integrate</b>	To combine or bring together into a whole
<b>Integrity</b>	Honesty and moral uprightness
<b>Interactive</b>	Involving active participation and engagement in the learning process
<b>Internet</b>	A global computer network providing information and communication
<b>Intrepid</b>	Fearless and adventurous
<b>Intricate</b>	Having many complex details or parts
<b>Intrinsic</b>	Motivation that comes from within oneself, driven by personal satisfaction or interest rather than external rewards
<b>Intuition</b>	The ability to understand or know something without the need for conscious reasoning
<b>Invasive</b>	Describes nonnative species that aggressively spread and harm the ecosystem they enter

<b>Irony</b>	A literary technique in which there is a discrepancy between appearance and reality, often involving a surprising or unexpected twist
<b>Irresolute</b>	Uncertain how to act or proceed; indecisive
<b>Irrigation</b>	The artificial application of water to land or soil to assist in the growth of crops or vegetation
<b>Irritate</b>	To annoy or provoke
<b>Isolate</b>	To set apart or separate from others
<b>Jacket</b>	A piece of outerwear worn over clothing to provide warmth and protection
<b>Jagged</b>	Having a rough, uneven, or sharp-edged surface, like the edges of mountains or cliffs
<b>Journals</b>	Books or notebooks used for recording thoughts, experiences, or academic work
<b>Jubilant</b>	Feeling or expressing great joy and happiness
<b>Jungle</b>	A dense and tangled forest in a tropical or subtropical region
<b>Juxtapose</b>	To place two things side by side for comparison
<b>Kelp</b>	Large brown algae that grow in underwater forests along coastlines
<b>Keyboard</b>	A set of keys used to input data into a computer or other electronic device
<b>Kiln</b>	A furnace or oven used for burning, drying, or baking materials such as pottery, bricks, or lime
<b>Kindergarten</b>	A preschool program for young children before starting formal education
<b>Kindle</b>	To ignite or arouse a feeling or emotion
<b>Kinship</b>	A close connection or relationship

<b>Knowledge</b>	Information and understanding gained through experience or education
<b>Laboratory</b>	A controlled environment for scientific experiments and research
<b>Lagoon</b>	A shallow body of water separated from a larger body of water by a barrier, such as a sandbar or barrier island
<b>Lamp</b>	A portable light source typically consisting of a bulb and a shade
<b>Lavish</b>	Extravagant or excessive in spending or giving
<b>Legitimate</b>	Lawful or valid
<b>Lethargic</b>	Lacking in energy or enthusiasm
<b>Library</b>	A place where books and other reading materials are kept and made available for borrowing
<b>Lichen</b>	A composite organism consisting of a fungus and a photosynthetic partner (usually an alga or cyanobacterium) that live together in a mutualistic relationship
<b>Luminous</b>	Emitting or reflecting light; bright or shining
<b>Magnitude</b>	The size or extent of something
<b>Malevolent</b>	Having or showing a wish to do evil to others
<b>Mangrove</b>	A salt tolerant tree or shrub that grows in coastal wetlands and plays a vital role in protecting shorelines from erosion
<b>Mascot</b>	A person, animal, or object that is often associated with a sports team and serves as a symbol or good luck charm
<b>Mathematics</b>	The study of numbers, quantities, shapes, and patterns
<b>Meadow</b>	A grassy field or open area, typically with wildflowers and low vegetation
<b>Meander</b>	To wander aimlessly or follow a winding path

<b>Medal</b>	A metal disc or decoration awarded to athletes as a symbol of achievement in sports competitions
<b>Melancholy</b>	A feeling of deep sadness or sorrow
<b>Memorization</b>	The process of committing information to memory through repetition
<b>Metamorphosis</b>	A complete change in form or nature
<b>Metaphor</b>	A figure of speech that makes a direct comparison between two unrelated things to create a new and often symbolic meaning
<b>Meticulous</b>	Extremely careful and precise
<b>Microwave</b>	An appliance used for cooking or heating food quickly using microwaves
<b>Momentum</b>	The force or energy gained by a moving object or by progress in a particular direction, often motivating continued progress
<b>Motivated</b>	having a strong reason to act or accomplish something.
<b>Mysterious</b>	Difficult to understand or explain; enigmatic
<b>Necessity</b>	Something that is required or essential
<b>Nectar</b>	A sweet liquid produced by flowers to attract pollinators like bees and butterflies
<b>Negligent</b>	Failing to take proper care or show due diligence
<b>Negligible</b>	So small or insignificant as to not be worth considering
<b>Nestling</b>	A young bird that is still in the nest and not yet able to fly
<b>Newspaper</b>	A printed publication containing news, articles, and advertisements
<b>Nonchalant</b>	Appearing casually calm and relaxed; indifferent



<b>Nostalgia</b>	A sentimental longing for the past
<b>Notebook</b>	A bound book with pages for writing and notetaking
<b>Notetaking</b>	The practice of recording important information during lectures or reading
<b>Oasis</b>	A fertile area in a desert where water is available, often supporting vegetation and wildlife
<b>Obliterate</b>	To destroy completely or erase
<b>Oblivion</b>	The state of being forgotten or unknown
<b>Obnoxious</b>	Extremely unpleasant or offensive
<b>Obstacle</b>	A barrier or hindrance
<b>Ominous</b>	Suggesting that something bad is about to happen
<b>Optimistic</b>	having or showing hope for the future.
<b>Onomatopoeia</b>	The formation of words that imitate the sounds they represent
<b>Orchard</b>	A cultivated area where fruit bearing trees (e.g., apple, pear) are grown
<b>Orchestra</b>	A musical ensemble typically consisting of various instruments
<b>Oven</b>	A kitchen appliance used for baking, roasting, and cooking food
<b>Overtime</b>	An additional period of play in a game or match when the score is tied at the end of regular time

<b>Palette</b>	The flat surface on which artists mix and blend colours before applying them to a canvas or other surface
<b>Paradox</b>	A statement or situation that seems contradictory
<b>Paradoxical</b>	Seemingly contradictory or opposed to common sense
<b>Paranoia</b>	An irrational fear or suspicion of others
<b>Participation</b>	Involvement and engagement in classroom activities and discussions
<b>Passion</b>	A powerful and intense emotion or enthusiasm for something, often motivating dedicated effort
<b>Pen</b>	A writing instrument with ink that is held in a casing
<b>Pencil</b>	A writing instrument with a thin, cylindrical graphite core encased in wood or plastic
<b>Perceptive</b>	Having keen insight or understanding
<b>Pernicious</b>	Having a harmful effect, especially in a gradual or subtle way
<b>Perpetual</b>	Continuing indefinitely; never-ending
<b>Perseverance</b>	Persistence in the face of difficulty
<b>Pervasive</b>	Spreading widely throughout an area or group
<b>Pinnacle</b>	The highest point or peak of achievement
<b>Pitcher</b>	In baseball, the player who throws the ball to the batter from the pitcher's mound

<b>Plausible</b>	Seemingly reasonable or probable, often deceptively so
<b>Plot</b>	The sequence of events in a story, including the exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution
<b>Pollination</b>	The process by which pollen is transferred from the male reproductive organs of a flower to the female reproductive organs, enabling fertilization and seed production
<b>Pond</b>	A small, still body of water, typically shallow and often home to various aquatic plants and animals
<b>Ponder</b>	To think deeply or carefully about something
<b>Portrait</b>	A work of art that depicts a person, usually focusing on their face and expression
<b>Pragmatic</b>	Practical and focused on achieving results
<b>Precarious</b>	Dangerously unstable or uncertain
<b>Premiere</b>	The first public showing of a film, typically attended by the cast, crew, and invited guests before its general release
<b>Prescription</b>	A written order from a licensed medical professional for the dispensing of medication or specific medical treatment
<b>Pristine</b>	In its original condition; unspoiled
<b>Procrastinate</b>	To delay or postpone tasks
<b>Professor</b>	A senior academic faculty member at a university who typically teaches, conducts research, and publishes scholarly work
<b>Proficient</b>	Skilled or competent
<b>Prolific</b>	Producing many works, results, or offspring

<b>Protagonist</b>	The main character in a story, often the one with whom the audience identifies and follows through the narrative
<b>Punctual</b>	Being on time and consistently meeting deadlines or appointments
<b>Pungent</b>	Having a strong, sharp, or penetrating smell or taste
<b>Purpose</b>	The reason or intention behind a specific action or the motivation that drives a person's decisions and efforts
<b>Pythagorean Theorem</b>	A fundamental theorem in geometry that relates the lengths of the sides of a right triangle
<b>Quarry</b>	A place where stone, minerals, or other valuable substances are extracted from the earth
<b>Quench</b>	To satisfy one's thirst or desires; to extinguish or put out (fire)
<b>Quicksand</b>	A type of loose, water-saturated soil that becomes unstable when disturbed, often trapping objects or people.
<b>Quilt</b>	A bed covering made of two layers of fabric filled with padding
<b>Quixotic</b>	Exceedingly idealistic or unrealistic
<b>Quizzes</b>	Short assessments or tests to evaluate knowledge or understanding
<b>Quotations</b>	Passages or phrases from books, speeches, or other sources
<b>Quotidian</b>	Occurring daily or commonplace; ordinary
<b>Racket</b>	A piece of sports equipment, such as a tennis or badminton racket, used to hit a ball or shuttlecock
<b>Radiology</b>	The branch of medicine that uses medical imaging techniques like Xray's, CT scans, and mris to diagnose and treat diseases

<b>Rainforest</b>	A dense, tropical forest with high rainfall and diverse plant and animal life
<b>Reciprocal</b>	Mutual or given in return
<b>Reciprocity</b>	The practice of exchanging things with others for mutual benefit
<b>Reconciliation</b>	The act of making amends or restoring a friendly relationship
<b>Referee</b>	An official who enforces the rules of a sport and makes decisions during a game or match
<b>Reforestation</b>	The process of replanting and restoring a forest that has been cut down or depleted
<b>Refrigerator</b>	An appliance used for cooling and preserving food
<b>Rejuvenate</b>	To make someone or something feel young or fresh again
<b>Rendezvous</b>	A meeting at an agreed time and place
<b>Research</b>	The systematic investigation and study of a topic or issue, often conducted by university faculty and students to advance knowledge in various fields
<b>Resilience</b>	The ability to bounce back from adversity
<b>Resilient</b>	Capable of withstanding and recovering from difficult situations or setbacks
<b>Revitalize</b>	To renew or refresh
<b>Sanguine</b>	Optimistic or positive, especially in a difficult situation
<b>Savanna</b>	A grassy plain with scattered trees, found in tropical and subtropical regions

<b>Savor</b>	To enjoy or relish with great pleasure
<b>Sceptical</b>	Having doubts or reservations about something
<b>Science</b>	The study of the natural world, including biology, chemistry, and physics
<b>Score</b>	The result or number of points earned by a team or player in a game or match
<b>Screenplay</b>	The written script of a film, including dialogue, descriptions, and instructions for actors and crew
<b>Script</b>	The written text or screenplay that serves as the foundation for a film's story, dialogue, and action
<b>Sculpture</b>	Three-dimensional artwork created by shaping or carving materials such as wood, stone, metal, or clay
<b>Semester</b>	One of the two main academic terms within a university year, typically lasting around four to five months
<b>Serendipity</b>	The occurrence of fortunate events by chance
<b>Serene</b>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled
<b>Simultaneous</b>	Occurring, operating, or done at the same time
<b>Sinkhole</b>	A depression or hole in the ground caused by the collapse of a surface layer, often occurring in areas with soluble bedrock like limestone
<b>Socks</b>	Clothing worn on the feet for warmth and comfort
<b>Solitude</b>	The state of being alone or isolated from others
<b>Sonnet</b>	A poetic form consisting of 14 lines, typically with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often used to express love or deep emotions

<b>Soundtrack</b>	The collection of music and sound effects used in a film to enhance the overall audio experience
<b>Spectator</b>	A person who watches a sports event as a member of the audience or crowd
<b>Spontaneous</b>	Occurring naturally or without premeditation
<b>Sprint</b>	A short and fast race, often covering a distance of 100 meters or less in track and field
<b>Stadium</b>	A large, often outdoor, venue with seating for spectators, where sports events are held
<b>Statistics</b>	The branch of mathematics that deals with collecting, organizing, analysing, interpreting, and presenting data
<b>Storyboard</b>	A visual representation of a film's scenes, often in the form of illustrated panels, used to plan the visual sequences
<b>Student Union</b>	An organization or building on campus that provides services and activities for students, often representing their interests
<b>Substantial</b>	Of considerable size, importance, or value
<b>Substantiate</b>	To provide evidence or proof to support a claim or statement
<b>Subtle</b>	Not obvious or easily detected
<b>Superfluous</b>	Exceeding what is necessary; extra or surplus
<b>Syllabus</b>	An outline or summary of the topics covered in a course
<b>Symbolism</b>	The use of symbols or objects to represent deeper meanings, themes, or ideas in a literary work
<b>Symptom</b>	A subjective indication or characteristic of a disease or condition experienced by a patient, such as pain, fatigue, or fever



<b>Synchronize</b>	To coordinate or arrange to occur at the same time
<b>Tangible</b>	Perceptible by touch; capable of being touched or felt
<b>Teacher</b>	An educator who imparts knowledge and provides instruction
<b>Teamwork</b>	The collaborative effort and cooperation among members of a sports team to achieve a common goal
<b>Telephone</b>	A device used for voice communication over long distances
<b>Tempestuous</b>	Characterized by strong and turbulent emotions or weather
<b>Tenacious</b>	Persistent and determined in pursuing goals or objectives, often despite challenges or obstacles
<b>Testimonial</b>	A written or spoken statement of recommendation or praise
<b>Thrive</b>	To grow and prosper
<b>Tide</b>	The rise and fall of the sea level caused by the gravitational pull of the moon and sun
<b>Tornado</b>	A violent and destructive rotating column of air extending from a thunderstorm to the ground
<b>Tournament</b>	A competition involving a series of games or matches, often leading to a final winner
<b>Tranquil</b>	Calm and peaceful
<b>Treatment</b>	The medical care and interventions provided to manage or cure a disease or alleviate its symptoms
<b>Trivial</b>	Of little importance or significance

<b>Tuition</b>	The fees paid by students for instruction and education at a university
<b>Ubiquitous</b>	Present, appearing, or found everywhere
<b>Ubiquity</b>	The state of being present everywhere at the same time
<b>Umbrella</b>	A portable canopy used to protect against rain or sun
<b>Unanimous</b>	Fully agreed upon by everyone involved
<b>Undergrowth</b>	Low growing plants, shrubs, and vegetation beneath the canopy in a forest
<b>Uniform</b>	A specific set of clothing and gear worn by athletes to represent their team or country
<b>University</b>	An institution of higher education offering undergraduate and postgraduate programs
<b>Unprecedented</b>	Never before known or experienced
<b>Uplift</b>	The process of raising or elevating land or rock due to geological forces
<b>Vaccine</b>	A biological preparation that stimulates the immune system to provide immunity against a specific infectious disease
<b>Vacuum</b>	A device used for cleaning floors and surfaces by suction
<b>Validate</b>	To confirm or prove the accuracy or validity of something
<b>Vegetation</b>	Plant life in general, including all the plants in a particular area or ecosystem
<b>Vehement</b>	Showing strong feeling or intensity

<b>Venerable</b>	Accorded a great deal of respect, especially because of age, wisdom, or character
<b>Veracity</b>	The quality of being truthful or honest
<b>Vernal</b>	Relating to spring or the fresh, green growth of springtime
<b>Versatile</b>	Capable of adapting and performing well in various roles or situations
<b>Visual aids</b>	Objects or materials used to enhance learning through visual representation
<b>Vocabulary</b>	A collection of words used by a person or within a particular field of study
<b>Vulnerability</b>	The state of being susceptible to harm or damage
<b>Wallet</b>	A small, flat case for carrying cash, cards, and personal items
<b>Waterfall</b>	A cascade of water falling from a height, often over rocks or cliffs
<b>Wetland</b>	A habitat that is covered with water for at least part of the year, such as swamps, marshes, and bogs
<b>Whimsical</b>	Characterized by unpredictability or capriciousness
<b>Workbook</b>	A supplementary book with exercises and practice materials for students
<b>Writing</b>	The act of composing text or conveying thoughts and ideas through written words
<b>Xerophyte</b>	A plant adapted to survive in arid or dry conditions, often with specialized water storing features
<b>Xerox</b>	To make a copy of a document using a photocopier

<b>Xylem</b>	The tissue in plants that conducts water and dissolved nutrients from the roots to the leaves
<b>Xylophone</b>	A musical instrument consisting of wooden bars struck with mallets
<b>Yard</b>	An outdoor area around a house or building, typically with grass or plants
<b>Yearbook</b>	A publication featuring photographs and memories of a school year
<b>Yield</b>	The amount of agricultural or natural product produced
<b>Youth</b>	Young people collectively, often referring to school age children and teenagers
<b>Yucca</b>	A type of succulent plant with long, sword shaped leaves and often tall, flowering spikes
<b>Zealous</b>	Enthusiastic and passionate
<b>Zenith</b>	The highest point or peak; the point in the sky directly above an observer
<b>Zephyr</b>	A gentle, mild breeze or wind
<b>Zoology</b>	The scientific study of animals and their behaviour, physiology, and classification
<b>Zoom</b>	A video conferencing platform often used for online classes and meetings
<b>Zucchini</b>	A type of summer squash often used in cooking
